The Cafeteria is continuing to happily offer each student one free breakfast, and one free lunch to each student every day.

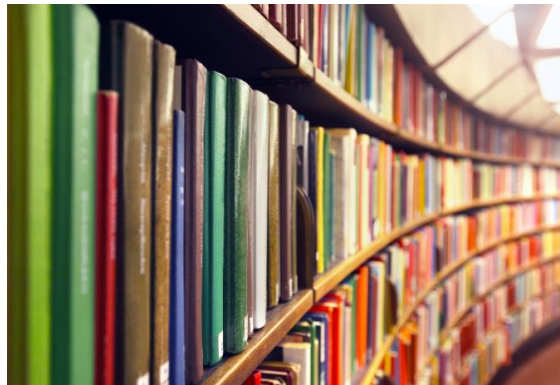

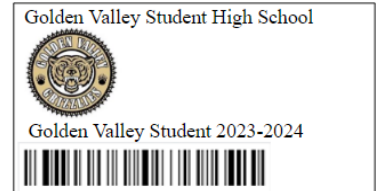

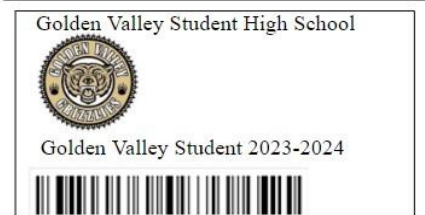

Steps to Obtaining a Work Permit

Starting on December 18th, the District Office will offer appointments for students to come to the District Office to obtain a work permit. The directions and dates that will be available for an appointment are below. Please update your site's websites.

Please remember that in order to obtain an appointment a student needs to send an email to workpermit@hartsdistrict.org. Appointments will be offered every 15 minutes. The directions to obtain a work permit are below.

Please be sure you have completed the following steps prior to applying for a work permit:

STEP 1: Secure Employment

Students need to secure a job before obtaining a work permit.

STEP 2: Download the Work Permit Application

STEP 3: Complete the Work Permit Application:

1. **Students** are to complete the sections "Minor's Information" and "School Information."
2. **Employers** are to complete the section "For Employer to Complete" then print and sign their name.
3. **Parents/guardians** are required to sign the form for knowledge and consent.

STEP 4: Email workpermit@hartsdistrict.org. During Winter Break - December 18 - January 5th work permits will be issued at the Hart District Office - 21380 Centre Pointe Parkway, Santa Clarita, CA 91350. The permits will be issued **by appointment only** during the below times.

The appointments are 15 minutes and can be made by emailing workpermit@hartsdistrict.org.

May is Mental Health Awareness Month and the GROWL Center is busy spreading the word across our campus! Mental health awareness can help reduce stigma and discrimination around mental illness and treatment. We always want to encourage our students to seek support when they are feeling challenged. The GROWL Center offers a variety of supports in the forms of one-on-one counseling, support groups, connecting students to on-campus and community resources, lead classroom presentations, and host a variety of lunchtime activities that are designed to promote mental wellness. Our Peer Counseling program is an integral part in helping to create a culture where students feel comfortable to talk openly about their feelings with one another through a nonjudgmental lens. The GROWL Center is here to support our students' mental health journey, not just in May but every month! "Mental health problems don't define who you are. They are something you experience. BUILDING YOUR COPING TOOLBOX

Everyone goes through periods of tough times, and it's important to take care of yourself and have tools on standby to use when times get difficult. A coping toolbox is a collection of skills, techniques, items, and other suggestions that you can turn to as soon as you start to feel anxious or distressed. Healthy coping skills can help you feel better physically and psychologically, and can improve your ability to perform well.

No one thing works for everyone, and it may take some trial and error, but building a coping toolbox is a great way to be prepared for those times when your mental well-being starts to slip – think of it as a safety net. You must practice coping skills often and regularly to see changes. This will allow you to become comfortable using the skill and it might even help you to develop muscle memory. This unites one's mind and body in a "flow-state" making it easier to recall the learned activity when that hard time inevitably creeps up.

Creating your toolbox can be as simple as writing a list of what helps, like breathing exercises or going for a run – this way, when you start struggling with your mental health, you don't have to remember what to do or search for tips. You can also have a physical toolbox and fill it with things like a stress ball, written notes to yourself, and photos that make you happy. Your toolbox will look different as you progress through life and try out new things. What does yours consist of today?

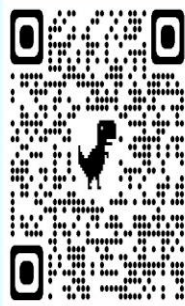
