

Mr. Nielsen:

- Construction continues @ Hart and Castaic.
- Modernization @ Bowman, Valencia, et al. going to start soon.
- Pick-up/drop off days @ all schools
 - Text books, PE gear, etc.
 - Being done safely with “drive-by” procedures
- Graduation – waiting until 5/15 (when the County health orders expires), but planning ahead for last week in July (if we are allowed by law)
 - May have to go to December
 - Co. health order may be relaxed some, but don’t know details yet
- MK: Virtual Graduation is going to be really cool
 - Keepsake memory for kids and families
 - Video that can be streamed after release (it’s pre-recorded), to be watched with graduate and families linked in if wanted
 - To be released on date of original graduation (GVHS: June 2)

Ms. Hunter:

- There is a high percentage of kids signing on to mental health services online
- Social Workers – Care Portal posting 5-6 requests for assistance per day
- Local Churches are coming to their aide with clothes, food etc
- Wellness Centers now have a whole page on Dist.’s site for Wellness
 - Meditation every a.m.
 - Yoga Zoom meetings every Weds.
- Pete Goetz taking over Student Services for next year
- Special Ed is moving forward with Summer School (ESY)
 - Other special services are continuing online
 - ERICs
 - Speech

MK: We are not starting the next school year in July. Regular August start, but up to what County health orders are then.

Mr. Vierra:

- Working on staffing for next year. Working on collective bargains
- About 200 less students next year

Mr. Peschek:

- ESY planning program with OFL (online Model)
- Food Services are being extended at 3 sites until June 30 due to critical need (which has more than doubled since March). See Hart Dist. Website for locations and hours.

- Dist. offers, breakfast and lunch, not dinners. However, elementary schools do offer dinner.
- On Fridays – Dist. is sending home sack with frozen food for the weekends.
- Going to apply for continued summer food distribution.
- Refunding \$\$\$ - schools are starting to process these
 - Not able to process Proms yet due to negotiations with vendors.
- Budget being revised by Gov on 5/14
 - Be prepared for -2% COLA
 - Will be updated on 5/20 at Board Mtg.

Mr. Kuhlman:

- Proposed Grading Modifications:
 - Goals: not going to P/F
 - Hold students harmless
 - Minimize student failures
 - Intervention plan due to potential gaps in learning
 - Alternate grading system:
 - A,B,C, Credit/No Credit
 - Student has option of selecting Credit/No Credit through December
 - Will not be calculated into their GPA
 - CA Universities are backing this
 - Limit “No Credit”
 - Only students that were failing on 3/20 will be eligible for NC
 - “All students who are on track to graduate, should be able to graduate” (quote from SBE)
 - No Final Exams (traditional)
 - Only assignment that will help students’ grades, bumping it up
 - Flexible Finish Line:
 - Weeks 5/22 – 6/4
 - It is up to teachers to use this time to assist students who need extra focus
 - Bowman – graduation requirement reduction from 230 credits to 220 credits (which are electives only)
- Our District has thought through our responses and changes to policies so that no student is left behind.
- We are in the middle of what other districts are doing.
 - “The elevator to success is broken, so take the stairs.”
