The Cafeteria is continuing to happily offer each student one free breakfast, and one free lunch to each student every day.







In order for students to obtain a work permit, students must have a minimum of a 2.0 with no "F's" and have 20 days or less of unexcused tardies and/or absences in a quarter.

The process to obtain a work permit is outlined below.

Steps to Obtaining a Work Permit

Step 1: Secure Employment

Students need to secure a job before obtaining a work permit.

Step 2: Download the work permit application linked [HERE](#).

Step 3: Complete the work permit application:

1. Students are to complete the sections "Minor's Information" and "School Information."
2. Employers are to complete the section "For Employer to Complete" - print and sign their name.
3. Parents/guardians are required to sign the form for knowledge and consent.

Step 4: Return documentation to Lia Boscarino in the AP office

Please be sure you have completed the following steps prior to applying for a work permit:

STEP 1: Secure Employment: Students need to secure a job before obtaining a work permit.

STEP 2: Download the Work Permit Application on the GV website.

STEP 3: Complete the Work Permit Application. Please have all information filled out including student, parent, and employer signatures.

Great Minds in STEM Scholarship



Applicants must demonstrate merit through academic achievements, leadership and campus/community activities. Applicants must be pursuing a **science, technology, engineering or math** degree. Applicants must have an **overall minimum GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale** for merit-based scholarships. Applicants may have a minimum 2.5 GPA for non-merit-based donor scholarships. Applicants must be of Hispanic descent **and/or** must demonstrate significant leadership or service within the underserved community. Applicants may be enrolled full-time or part-time at the time of application and the time of the scholarship award.

Applicants must be enrolled in a STEM or health-related undergraduate or graduate program for the upcoming fall semester, at an accredited 2-yr or 4-yr college/university in the **U.S. or its territories**. If you have already earned a bachelors degree and are seeking support for another bachelors degree OR you have already earned a masters degree and are seeking support for another masters degree OR you have already earned a doctoral degree and are seeking support for another doctoral degree, you are **ineligible to apply** to this scholarship program.

ASHRAE Scholarship

Four one-year \$3,000 scholarships available to high school seniors about to enter full time into their first year of college in a pre-engineering, engineering, or engineering technology program leading to a bachelor's degree in a course of study that traditionally has been a preparatory curriculum for the HVAC&R profession. Applicants must be high school seniors with a cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 3.0 on a scale where 4.0 is the highest and/or a class standing of no less than the top 30% and accepted into an engineering, pre-engineering, or engineering technology program at a post-secondary educational institution that meets at least one of the criteria mentioned on their website.

The Shawn Carter Scholarship Fund (SCSF) was founded on the belief that any motivated individual in need should have the opportunity to further his or her education. By removing some of the financial burdens associated with going to, surviving in, and graduating from college, the SCSF plays a vital role in increasing college access and success for many motivated yet underserved youth and young adults. The SCSF provides individual grants, paid directly to the educational institution, to every student who qualifies and reapplies yearly, from admission to graduation.

The grant can be used to cover tuition expenses and related supplemental educational expenses such as books, lab fees, travel and select costs of living. All Shawn Carter Scholars are required to "give back" by conducting community service and by serving as mentors to younger, aspiring Shawn Carter Scholars.




